

Highfield Level 2 Award for Working as a Door Supervisor in the Private Security Industry (RQF)

Under the Private Security Industry Act 2001, all door supervisors must hold a license to practice, issued by the Security Industry Authority (SIA). To work as a door supervisor you need to apply for a SIA license.

You cannot get your SIA license without first attending this training course and gaining the Door Supervisor qualification. Once you have your license you can start earning and have an exciting career in the security industry earning rates of between £8-10 per hr, and salaries of £19K+ year.

Qualification Structure

This qualification consists of four units, which learners must complete successfully in order to achieve the qualification, they are;

- Unit 1 – Working within the Private Security Industry
- Unit 2 – Working as a Door Supervisor within the Private Security Industry
- Unit 3 – Conflict Management within the Private Security Industry
- Unit 4 – Physical Intervention Skills within the Private Security Industry

Duration

Courses are delivered over two consecutive weekends. (Saturdays and Sundays) Plus some distance learning for Unit 1 before attending this training. Duration will be 4 days of classroom learning (7-8 hours each day).

How will I be assessed?

4 multiple-choice examinations and a practical test of your physical intervention skills.

Entry Requirements

All learners are required to demonstrate a good grasp of the English language, as assessments are only available in this language. This may involve completing a short assessment prior to enrolment. This qualification is aimed at learners aged over 18, due to age restrictions on applying for a license. From the 1st April 2020 all learners must present with a Level 3 Emergency First Aid at Work qualification before undertaking an SIA course in Security or Door Supervision.

Photo and ID Requirements

You will need to bring ID with you to be able to sit the exams. If you have a current Passport *and* a photo driving license these will be ideal. Alternatively you can bring your birth certificate if you do not have a passport or driving license – along with two other forms of ID

showing your current address such as a recent utility bill, P45/P60, Council Tax statement (less than 12 months old) or bank statement (less than 3 months old). Please refer to the ID requirements sheet which you will be sent with your joining instructions to make sure you will have the correct and sufficient amount of ID to be able to do the course and sit the exams.

Joining Instructions

On receipt of your completed enrolment form and course fee, you will receive detailed and informative instructions. This will include information on the distance learning unit you will need to complete prior to attendance.

Cancellations

In the unfortunate event you have to cancel your course a cancellation fee may apply.

Cancellation fees are as follows;

Cancellation within 21 days of the start date: 50% of course fee applies.

Cancellation within 7 days of course start date or non-attendance: full course fee applies.

Deposits are non-refundable.

Progression

Upon successful completion learners may wish to continue their development via the completion of any of the sign-posted qualifications/training:

Highfield Level 2 Award in CCTV Operations (Public Space Surveillance) (RQF)

Highfield Level 3 Certificate for Working as a Close Protection Operative (RQF)

Cost: £237 (including vat)

How to Pay: By BACS using online banking, or by cash or debit/credit card.

The full course fee will be due on enrolment.

FROM 1ST APRIL 2020 - The SIA qualifications are changing from 1st April 2020 and the Door Supervisor course will become a 6 day course including pre-course study, so we will be running these courses four times a year, on the dates as follows;

Spring 2020 – April 11th & 12th, April 18th & 19th and April 25th & 26th 2020

Summer 2020 – June 13th & 14th, June 20th & 21st and June 27th & 28th 2020

Autumn 2020 - 17th & 18th October, 24th & 25th October and 31st October and 1st Nov 2020.

Winter 2020/2021 – 16th & 17th January 2021, 23rd and 24th Jan 2021, 30th and 31st Jan 2021

You must complete an Emergency First Aid at Work course prior to enrolling. Or send us a copy of a First Aid certificate you already hold which must have at least 12 months expiry from the day your door supervisor course starts. Our first aid trainers have sector competence in security and we offer these courses every month so ask us for the information and enrol today.

Alternative SIA Courses

Manned Guarding

If you are looking to working Security you may want to complete the Security Officer course initially which is only 4 days duration over two weekends and then consider progressing to becoming a Door Supervisor later in your career if you decide you wish to work on licensed premises.
